USEF SAFE SPORT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS TO COMPETE

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.USEF.org.

Every USEF adult member (18 years of age & older) with a Competing Membership must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training, overseen by the U.S. Center for SafeSport.

An adult member may be OWNER, RIDER, TRAINER and/or COACH. Adult members listed on the entry must complete the entire course and be Safe Sport Trained by the first day of competition. Safe Sport Training must be completed by all adult members on the entry or the rider will not be allowed to compete.

You may access the Safe Sport modules from your USEF member dashboard at www.USEF.org.

SHOW NOTICE

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the show grounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.

SFDA COVID-19 Guidelines - Mandatory Requirements for Competition Participants & Spectators

1) Access

- a) Participants & Spectators are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the competition grounds. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4° F (38° C) or higher may not enter the competition grounds.
- b) A Participant can be a rider, owner, trainer, coach, groom, staff, official, volunteer, parent or service provider. Only 1 groom per day per horse is allowed.
- c) Every Participant on the competition grounds must sign a USEF Waiver and Release of Liability Form before entering the competition grounds. Any Participant who enters the competition grounds must wear a wristband at all times and it must be visible. Sharing wristbands with unauthorized individuals will result in disqualification and the Participant and individual(s) will be asked to leave the competition grounds immediately.
- d) Participants who have been fully vaccinated are not required to wear a face mask/face covering while on the competition grounds. But any Participant who has not been fully vaccinated must wear a face mask/face covering at all times. Proper wearing of a face mask/face covering is to cover the nose and mouth. Face shields without a face mask/face covering are not in compliance following the guidelines of USEF. Any individual may choose to wear a face mask/face covering even when not required, and can do so without penalty.
- e) The following individuals are not allowed to enter the competition grounds:
 - i) Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms,
 - ii) Anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 10 days,
 - iii) Anyone who has tested positive outside of the past 10 days, but is still symptomatic,
 - iv) Anyone who has been exposed to or has been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 symptoms or has tested positive for COVID-19 within either the last 7 or 10 days.

2) Feeling Ill During the Competition

- a) If a person starts running a temperature or begins to feel ill during the competition, they should go to the Show Medic first before attempting to leave the competition grounds. If symptoms are COVID related, the person will be isolated until an ambulance arrives to take them to the nearest hospital for medical attention. The individual or someone with them must provide contact information to the Show Medic before leaving the competition grounds.

3) Social Distancing/Participant & Spectator Protocols

- a) Participants & Spectators must comply with social distancing requirements at all times while on the competition grounds.
- b) A minimum of 6 feet is the separation required.

4) Hand Washing

- a) Wash hands often and adhere to other sanitization practices throughout the day. Hand sanitizer stations are positioned throughout the competition grounds.

5) Spectators

- a) Spectators are permitted to attend the competition and are subject to the same requirements as all other persons on the competition grounds and must adhere to the USEF COVID-19 Action Plan protocols for Spectators. Any Spectator can be removed from the competition grounds for non-compliance of Spectator protocols.
- b) If a Spectator has not been fully vaccinated, they must wear a face mask/face covering at all times.

6) Participants

- a) Once competition rides are completed for the day, the rider and everyone associated with the rider should vacate the competition grounds.
- b) Participants should not congregate in the aisles or at the end of the aisles.

7) Competition Ground Hours

- a) Thursday - The competition grounds entrance will open at 10:00am.
- b) Friday/Saturday/Sunday - The competition grounds entrance will open at 5:30am.

8) Warm-up for Thursday and Competition Days

- a) For Thursday, the number of riders may be limited in the warm-up and competition arenas at any given time. No exceptions. Warm-up and competition arenas for practice open at 11:30am on Thursday.
- b) During the competition, arrive with your horse to the warm-up arena no sooner than 60 minutes before your scheduled ride time. If you arrive sooner than this approved time you will be asked to leave the warm-up arena.

9) Golf Carts

- a) Individuals are allowed to be seated together while being transported by golf cart (or similar four-wheeled transport vehicle), but capacity may not exceed the number of seats on the cart or vehicle. Congregating on or around a parked or stationary golf cart or vehicle is prohibited.

10) Failure to Comply

- a) Any Participant or Spectator who violates the COVID-19 Guidelines of this competition may be asked to leave the competition grounds. Entry fees will not be refunded.

11) After the Competition

- a) Anyone testing positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of the conclusion of the competition must inform Competition Management, USEF (ksacco@usef.org) and local health authorities.

Entries:

Accepted on a first come, first serve basis by on-line entries only, see below. This is a two show weekend. Each show requires a separate entry if entering both shows. One entry per horse/rider combination per show.

On-Line Entries:

Visit HorseShowSolutions.com or EqEntries.com opening day. Required documents are the USEF Entry Agreement, which is the second page of the entry form and requires signatures for everyone listed on the entry (see next page for the definition of a Trainer and Coach on the entry), Coggins and current Flu/Rhino vaccination records. These documents may be uploaded in Equestrian Entries and submitted with the show entry or e-mailed separately to the Show Secretary. You must also provide the *USEF Waiver and Release of Liability Form* for everyone listed on the entry. If bringing a groom, the Waiver is required. These Waivers may be uploaded in Equestrian Entries and submitted with the show entry or e-mailed separately to the Show Secretary. Entries without current and correct association number verification will be considered incomplete and the membership verification fee applies for each entry.

Please note, the *USEF Entry Agreement* and *USEF Waiver and Release of Liability Form* may be found on the last 2 pages of this document. Both forms are PDF fillable forms. USEF will accept a typed name on the signature line and it will have the same validity, force and effect as a hand written signature. You must save each form with a different file name after completion. Otherwise, your information will not be saved to the updated forms.

Management requires that all entries be created on EqEntries.com. If you do not already have a user account with Equestrian Entries, please sign up. There is no fee to join Equestrian Entries to create an entry. You may pay on-line with a credit card or mail a personal check to the Show Secretary for the total entry fees. If you choose to pay on-line, there is a 5% fee plus a \$5.00 handling charge. If paying with a personal check you must inform the Show Secretary that you have created an entry in Equestrian Entries and will be mailing a check for the entry fees.

Each competitor is responsible for supplying show management with the correct, current and required association numbers of USEF and USDF for the horse, owner, rider/handler, trainer and coach (trainer and coach are exempt from USDF membership requirements), with their on-line entry. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct and active numbers may not count towards national awards.

Any fees incorrectly charged to the entry and paid for with EqEntries will be refunded to the credit card used for the entry.

No telephone, mail, fax or e-mail entries will be accepted. **ALL FEES MUST ACCOMPANY ON-LINE ENTRIES OR A PERSONAL CHECK MUST BE MAILED TO THE SHOW SECRETARY. Entries without payment in full will not be accepted.**

If paying by check, make check payable to SFDA. Mail check to Debbie Garris, PO Box 887, Grayslake, IL 60030.

On-line Entries must be received by June 28, 2021. Entries received after the closing date will be accepted **only if submitted and paid on-line** accompanied by a \$30 late entry fee per entry on a space-available basis. **Personal checks will not be accepted for late entries.**

Only one horse/rider combination per entry form.

Entry to show grounds will NOT be permitted if any entry documentation is missing.

This includes current and active memberships, all required entry signatures, Coggins and Flu/Rhino vaccination records as well as waivers for all those named on the entry form plus one groom, if bringing a groom to the show. The Show Secretary must receive all necessary missing documentation by Thursday, July 8, 2021 via e-mail. Competitors will **NOT** be allowed to enter the show office to fill out forms or provide paper copies – everything must be submitted electronically.

COVID-19 Safety Precautions:

SFDA will comply with the guidelines regarding COVID-19 as set forth by USEF and the State of New Mexico at the time of the show. As the show date approaches, we will inform Participants about any additional guidelines they need to be aware of. These will include but may not be limited to the signing of waivers, wearing face masks/coverings, wristbands and social distancing. SFDA has developed mandatory COVID-19 Guidelines for this competition. They may be viewed on the preceding page.

New Mexico Coggins/Health Certificate Law:

Equine residing in New Mexico: A current negative Coggins for EIA conducted within 12 months of the show date. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is not required for New Mexico equine. Unless, an in-state county has had a quarantine for vesicular stomatitis, then a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required within 14 days of arrival to the show grounds.

Equine entering New Mexico: All equine entering New Mexico must be accompanied by a current negative Coggins test for EIA conducted within 12 months of the show date and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of entry. If an out of state county had a quarantine of vesicular stomatitis, a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required within 14 days of entry.

USEF Equine Vaccination Rule:

Per USEF GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule; All equine entering this competition must provide with their entry, proof of current flu/rhino vaccinations within 6 months of the show BUT should be no later than 7 days before the show. If providing proof of vaccinations from your veterinarian it must be on the veterinarian's letterhead. E-mails without an attached letter from a veterinarian will not be accepted.

The horse name on the Coggins report and vaccination documentation MUST MATCH the horse's USEF registered name as listed on the entry form and on their USEF/USDF horse identification or recording documents, or it will not be accepted (USEF GR907.4).

Equine Activity Liability Statute Warning

ALL activities involving HORSES, donkeys, mules, or ponies have inherent risks for participants. New Mexico State law protects operators, owners, trainers, promoters, and others from liability for injuries which are the result of an equine animal's behavior. USE THESE FACILITIES AND/OR RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Equine Liability Act NMSA §§ 42 – 13 – 1 et seq (1993)

TRAINER, as listed on the entry form, is defined as any adult (18 years of age & older) who has responsibility for the care, custody or performance of the horse while the horse is on the competition grounds. This adult must sign the entry form as trainer.

COACH, as listed on the entry form, is defined as an adult (18 years of age & older) who gets paid for instructing, teaching, schooling or advising a rider with their horse on the competition grounds. This adult must sign the entry form as coach.

Non-Compete Horses:

Non-Compete horses are permitted on the show grounds. Must pay non-compete fee & office fee for each show & stabling.

Credit Cards:

Credit cards will be accepted during the show for on-line purchases of shavings and hay at the [HorseShowSolutions.com/Purchase Now](https://HorseShowSolutions.com/PurchaseNow) page. Contact Show Secretary with questions.

Returned Checks or Declined Credit Cards:

Checks returned by the bank or declined credit cards will be charged a penalty of \$50.00 or 10% of the face value of the declined amount, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given 10 days to be paid in full with cash or equivalent. Checks will NOT be deposited a second time. See USEF GR913 Unpaid Entries

Great American Insurance Group/USDF Qualifying Classes:

Qualifying classes will not require a separate ride. All exhibitors riding in the Open, Adult Amateur, & Junior/Young Rider classes will pay an additional \$15 USDF fee to have this score entered in the USDF qualifying class at that level. No separate ribbons or prizes will be awarded. Please add the additional \$15 to the on-line entry form for the qualifying class.

Rocky Mountain Dressage Society Recognition:

These competitions are recognized by the Rocky Mountain Dressage Society (RMDS). Please provide your RMDS membership number for Rider, Owner and Horse. Education membership is not applicable for RMDS awards.

USEF Intermediate I and Grand Prix Qualifying Classes:

Classes will have a panel of three (3) judges to qualify for the 2021 Festival of Champions.

Important notice to all affected parties:

Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings. If said parties fail to observe COVID-19 Guidelines, they will be asked to immediately leave the show grounds.

Pony Riders/Pony Measurement:

If you don't have a measurement card for the pony, you must notify the Show Secretary in writing with your entry. You will need to schedule an appointment to have this done prior to your first pony test and are required to pay the veterinarian fee for this service. Pony measurements will take place on Friday morning between 7:30am and 10:00am. The competitor will be notified of their appointment time.

A pony does not exceed 148 cm without shoes and 149 cm with shoes. Any pony competing in classes limited to ponies must submit a copy of a USEF Measurement Card with each entry.

Confirmation/Times:

Unofficial ride times and show updates will be posted no later than the Wednesday prior to the horse show at HorseShowSolutions.com. A Fox Village entry confirmation will be e-mailed to the rider.

E-mail addresses are required and must be active. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after reviewing the schedule.

Management reserves the right to change the time schedule after tentative times have been posted. A list of final ride times will be available at <https://horseshowsolutions.com/prize-list-show-info-2021/> and <https://www.foxvillage.com/Results>. Ride time will not be posted on the show grounds and will only be available electronically. This show follows USEF GR830 with regard to rescheduled ride times.

Entry Cancellation/Refunds:

Office fee is not refundable. Entries with written cancellation on or before the closing date will receive 100% refund of all fees minus the \$35 office fee. NO REFUNDS after Closing Date even if Closing Date is extended.

Scratches During Show:

Competitors have the responsibility to inform the Show Secretary by text or phone call of their intent to scratch a ride prior to the scheduled ride time. Scratches can be accepted at the competition arena with the Ring Steward but the competitor or representative must send a text to the Show Secretary at 312.401.1157 or call after securing their horse to officially scratch their ride. If texting or calling is a problem come to the show office to speak with the Show Secretary. Scratched rides are not refundable.

Adding a Class During the Show from a Scratched Ride:

Competitors may fill a scratched ride during the competition but must contact the Show Secretary first. Payment for an added class will be made by credit card on the HorseShowSolutions.com website page after the Show Secretary sends the rider a link from which to pay the added class fees. A post entry fee will be added to these classes entered during the show.

Show Schedule and Ride Time Conflicts:

It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the Show Secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.

Bedding:

\$11.00 per bale. Pre-ordered bedding will be delivered to the stall prior to arrival. During the show, additional bedding may be purchased on the HorseShowSolutions.com/Purchase Now website page by **2:00 pm each day**. No guarantees of same day delivery if ordered after **2:00 pm**.

No initial bedding is provided. Must purchase from HIPICO on the entry form or during the show. No outside bedding is allowed. Competitors are responsible for stall damage. Stalls are available on Thursday at 10:00 am unless special permission is given for early arrival.

Horse Stabling/Tack Stall Fees:

There are 2 types of stabling to choose from. Please select the stabling you want on your entry form.

The *Juniper Show Stabling* are temporary 10' x 10' stalls with doors. Walls are fixed and cannot be removed for expansion.

The *Desert Willow Stabling* are 12' x 12' stalls with Dutch-style doors. Construction is reinforced PVC panels on the bottom half, with steel frame and steel Dutch doors on top. Walls are fixed and cannot be removed for expansion. Desert Willow stabling is available on a first come, first serve basis.

All horses must have a stall. No haul-ins allowed.

Paddock Rental:

Paddocks are available to rent at \$125 for show weekend. Paddocks are limited. Contact Show Secretary.

Stall Cleaning:

Deposit all manure in designated area and not in the barn aisle itself.

Camper/RV Reservations:

Sharps/Medical Waste Disposal:

Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Containers to hold used syringes are located in the barn aisles and in the show office. Please do not use garbage cans for this material.

Safety Regulations:

Smoking or open-flame devices are not permitted within the stables.

Arenas/Footing:

Outdoor competition arenas are Standard 20m x 60m. Footing in competition arenas, warm-up and separate longeing area is sand composite with textile. Longeing is allowed only in the designated longeing area and not in the warm-up arena. Schooling may be permitted in the competition arena, weather permitting, on Thursday and at the conclusion of scheduled competition rides each day. Management may elect to run some classes, Introductory & Training Level classes, in a small arena if necessary provided the test is designed for a Small Arena.

No Shows:

All "No Shows" who have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.

Riders Under the Age of 14:

No rider under the age fourteen is permitted to ride a three-year old colt, or stallion of any age, in any under saddle class including Dressage Sport Horse Prospect Under Saddle, Materiale and Suitability classes. DR202.14

Consecutive Levels:

Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition.

Classes per Day:

Horses are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or two Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to two Dressage rides per day. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition.

Property Damage:

All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage occurred by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other property on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly.

Leaving the Competition:

No exhibitor may withdraw horses from a licensed show after it has commenced, or remove them from the show grounds without permission of the Show Secretary.

Food/Concessions:

Food and beverages will be available for purchase on the showgrounds.

Medical:

Medical personnel will be on grounds. Ambulance on call.

Dressage at Santa Fe I & II

Spectators:

Subject to state and local restrictions, spectators are permitted to attend USEF-Licensed competitions and are subject to the same requirements as all other persons on the competition grounds, which includes COVID-19 Guidelines of the show.

Sound Checks for Musical Freestyle Rides:

Riders must deliver music on good quality CDs, at check-in, or other digital file formats for freestyle music. E-mail MP3 and WAV format music at least 1 week before the show to the announcer at soundadviceautions@gmail.com. Sound checks will be conducted Thursday evening, 30 minutes before the first ride in the morning and during the lunch breaks on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Freestyle Entry:

Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Para Dressage Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or “open” Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. DR129.9

Dogs Must Be On Leashes At All Times While On Show Grounds: (includes stable areas)

Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule will be issued a Yellow warning card and may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7. (GR1301.6) No other pets or livestock other than horses/mules allowed on grounds.

Motorized Vehicle Statement:

In accordance with USEF GR1301.7 and GR1301.8: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. ***The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.*** Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (GR1301.7)

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (GR1301.8)

Helmets:

DR 120.6. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hatcovers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

Awards:

Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as Open. *Introductory through FEI levels* - Award and ribbon to 1st place, ribbon to 2nd through 6th place in each division (Open, Adult Amateur, JR-YR) in each class. First place prize awarded for classes of 4 or more in a division. Qualifying classes (GAIG/USDF) are run concurrently with your division class and there will be no separate ribbons awarded.

High Percentage Awards will be awarded for each show, for each division (Open, Adult Amateur, JR-YR) at USEF and FEI levels, and will be based on a simple high point percentage. Excludes Introductory, Freestyle, Exhibition Freestyle, Young Horse, Developing Horse, Dressage Seat Equitation, Materiale, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, Opportunity and Eventing Dressage class scores.

Ties will be broken in accordance with USEF DR123 - In case of equality of points the competitor with the highest marks received under General Impressions shall be declared the winner. When the scores for General Impressions are equal after coefficients have been applied, the horses must remain tied. DR123.3

Other awards may be available by show time, check with the Secretary for eligibility. All awards will be given at the show.

Fly Hoods Are Permitted For All Classes, Indoor and Outdoor:

Fly hoods (ear covers) that do not cover the horse's eyes can be used to protect horses from insects. Fly hoods may not be attached to the noseband. They should be discreet in color and design, and may have a promotional or manufacturer's logo that is in compliance with DR121.1.1.2. Fly hoods are permitted in the warm up and other training areas and for all classes. Fly hoods may be noise-cancelling in manufactured state but cannot be used with earplugs. If a tack inspection is performed after completion of the test, the rider or his/her representative is responsible for removing the fly hood and presenting it for inspection to the designated ring steward who will ensure that nothing prohibited has been added, such as earplugs. Blinkers or goggles (with clear or colored full eye cups) and fly masks that cover the horse's eyes are permitted in the warmup but are prohibited in the competition arena. Cooling caps (hoods) are prohibited in competition and warmup areas. DR121.8

Ear Plugs:

Ear plugs and ear muffs are, under penalty of elimination, prohibited. Exception: Ear plugs are permitted at prize-giving ceremonies for horses competing at any level, including High Performance classes. DR 121.9

Announcements:

Class announcements and ride time announcements are a courtesy to the exhibitor and not all shows provide the capability of public address announcements. Exhibitors are responsible for presenting themselves to the ring at their designated time and accept the full responsibility for doing so. Competitions offering public announcements will make every effort to maintain a working PA system, but it is stressed that it is still the exhibitors' responsibility to be on time. No protest will be upheld, nor any ride time changed, on the basis of a PA breakdown or missed announcement. Ring stewards will also make every effort to keep people informed and entering the ring in a timely fashion. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the correct show time and their scheduled performance time regardless of PA announcements or ring stewards. No protest will be upheld, nor ride time changed due to failure of the exhibitor to meeting their responsibilities.

Open Classes:

A class that is open to all. There are no restrictions based on the horse (age, sex, size, residence or membership of owner) or rider (age, experience, qualifications, sex, residence, etc.)

Adult Amateur Classes:

Participants must possess a current USEF Amateur Card and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules. Any non-member that wishes to participate in the Adult Amateur designated classes must purchase a USEF non-member amateur card for \$45 from USEF. Open to Adult Amateurs only; riders must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22.

Beginning January 1, 2021, anyone born in 1999 will turn 22 and is considered an adult for the purpose of competing in a dressage competition.

JR/YR Classes:

Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. DR119.3

For purposes of qualification for and participation in competitions conducted under FEI rules, age groups are as follows:

- a. Young Riders: Same as in DR119.3;
- b. Juniors: Individuals are eligible as Juniors from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18;
- c. Pony Riders: Individuals are eligible as Pony Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16;
- d. Children: Individuals are eligible to participate in competitions and championships for Children from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14;
- e. A person may compete as a U25 Rider from the beginning of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of sixteen (16) until the end of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of twenty-five (25). DR119.4

Must include birth date on entry form.

Adult Amateur Vintage/Master Classes:

A restricted class that is not open to all. Adult Amateur Vintage/Master Classes are open to any Adult Amateur rider 50 years of age or older. These classes are eligible as a GAIG/USDF Regional Championship qualifier.

Pony Classes:

Open to all breeds that meet the following measurement requirements. A pony is an animal that does not exceed 148 cm without shoes and 149 cm with shoes. The pony can be of any sex (mare, stallion, or gelding).

USEF Show Pass (non-member) Fee:

To be eligible to compete as a rider, handler, owner, lessee, agent, coach, or trainer at a USEF Licensed Competition an individual must be a USEF Senior Active, Junior Active, or Life member (GR202.1). Individuals unable to present proof of membership are required to complete a Show Pass Form and pay a fee in the amount of \$45. Entries in Introductory and Opportunity classes are exempt from this requirement.

USDF Non-member Fee:

For each USDF non-member owner/lessee and USDF non-member rider, there will be a USDF non-member fee of \$35 per competition. Entries in Introductory and Opportunity classes are exempt from this requirement.

USEF/USDF Horse ID Requirement:

All horses entered in USEF/USDF recognized shows must at least have a USDF HID (Horse Identification) number in order to participate. If riding in qualifying classes, you must have a USDF Lifetime Registration in addition to a USEF Annual or Lifetime Recording. Exempt from this requirement are horses showing in Introductory Level, Opportunity Classes, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, and exhibitions. These horse identification numbers may be obtained from USEF and USDF.

Hazardous Weather/Acts of God/Accident/Emergency Policy:

Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to Hazardous Weather, Acts of God, Accidents, Emergencies or Pandemics. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to Hazardous Weather, Acts of God, Accidents, Emergencies or Pandemics.

Opportunity Classes:

Any Opportunity Classes offered will include “Opportunity” in the class name. These classes will follow all USEF Dressage Division rules and applicable USEF General Rules, including dress and saddlery.

- Opportunity Classes are for entry level participants and these classes are judged by USEF licensed judges or FEI dressage judges.
- Horses and/or riders may enter in Opportunity Classes and cross enter into the rated/recognized classes at this competition. All applicable fees and membership requirements will apply.
- Opportunity Classes cannot be used as qualifying classes for the Great American/USDF Regional Championships.
- Freestyles or Test of Choice classes are not offered as Opportunity classes.
- Riders, Owners, Trainers and Coaches entered only in these classes are exempt from both USEF and USDF membership requirements and are not required to pay Show Pass/non-member fees but are required to list the USEF/USDF membership numbers if the participants are members.
- Horses entered only in these classes:
 - **Are** exempt from the USEF fee, including the Equine Drugs and Medication fee. Horses entered only in these classes are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing.
 - **Are not** required to have either a USEF or USDF Horse Identification (HID) or Recording Number but are to list the HID or Recording numbers if the horse has been assigned these numbers.

**MEMBERSHIP/REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS
FOR GAIG/USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES**

Riders must be current USDF Participating members & USEF members (Junior, Senior or Life) in good standing. Horses must be USDF registered and USEF recorded. Horses with only an HID are not eligible. Owners must be current USDF Participating or Business members & USEF members (Junior, Senior or Life) in good standing.

FOR USEF QUALIFYING FOR CHILDREN, PONY RIDERS, JUNIORS, YOUNG RIDERS, BRENTINA CUP (YOUNG ADULTS), YOUNG AND DEVELOPING HORSE DIVISIONS AND INTERMEDIATE I & GRAND PRIX FOR FESTIVAL OF CHAMPIONS.

At no time during the competition, may any horse entered in a USEF Qualifying class be ridden by anyone other than the athlete entered in that class on that horse, under penalty of disqualification from the class for USEF championship qualifying purposes. Exception: Grooms riding on a loose rein.

For purposes of this rule, the competition starts when horse and athlete arrive on the show grounds of the USEF Qualifying Competition and ends at the conclusion of the USEF licensed Dressage competition.

General Regulations and Policies

“EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.”

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

- Horses by their inherent nature present a risk. This show, the management, the USEF Licensee, and the facility will not be responsible for any loss or damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed, or in any way injured. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person, horse owned or exhibited by said exhibitor and shall indemnify the show, the management, the show committee and volunteers, the USEF Licensee, the USEF and USDF, or any member thereof, against all claims and demands, of any nature or kind, that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any horses owned or exhibited by them, or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse. All horses exhibited in this show participate entirely at the owner's risk.

Neither the Organizing Committee, show volunteers and staff, the facility or its owners, any host GMO, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

- Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit their entry fee and other fees.
- Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials and refuse any entry for a cause; to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.
- In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.
- No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.
- It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.
- Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses and should be aware of the US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules governing drugs and medications.

- ***A horse must wear their Bridle Tag Number at all times when not in a stall; which includes when a horse is being ridden or exercised.***
- Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the prize lists.

U.S. EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION, INC. ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the SFDA Dressage at Santa Fe I & II Shows (the "Competition").

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the Competition.

I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the Competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status.

I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top three riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- or*
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2021 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2021 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree to be bound and abide by the rules, regulations, and policies of USEF as published in the USEF Rule Book and on the website at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").
